Best GCSE Results Ever!


Dear Parents/ Carers,

This year 2019, we celebrated the best GCSE results ever achieved at Roding Valley High School. I am absolutely delighted with the improvements that the school has experienced and these results are a testament to the sheer commitment and hard work of all staff and students. I would also like to extend a sincere thank you to all the parents and carers who have continuously supported the school.

Our results in English, Maths and Science were significantly above the Essex and national averages

A record breaking 5 % of all grades were awarded at Grade 9 - more than double the national average. Grade 9 is the highest GCSE grade with attainment above an old A*. Grade 7 is the equivalent of an A on the old grading system.

Grade 5 will be known as a 'strong pass' and will be equivalent to a high C and low B on the old grading system (school performance measure).

Grade 4 will remain the level that students must achieve without needing to re-sit English and Maths post-16.

Through access to our excellent careers advice, our students also secure prestigious higher level apprenticeships.

Character and Culture

We have also worked tirelessly to instil a positive ethos in the school, to create a culture of aspiration, respect and endeavour in all our students. I really appreciate the parental support with uniform, equipment and supporting our behaviour policy, both in school and out in the local community.

Our Character and Culture programme allows students the time to further explore topics relevant to living a good, healthy life and being a good citizen.
