# FOR PARENTS OF YEAR 9 - POSITIVE CASE OF COVID 19 at Roding Valley High School

Advice for Child: Self-Isolate for 14 Days

Dear Parent or Carer,

We have been made aware this morning that we have a confirmed positive case of coronavirus (COVID-19) at Roding Valley High School in Year 9. This child developed symptoms on Wednesday but was last in school with all her peers on Monday 7th December.

As soon as we were made aware this morning, we ensured that there was no further mixing of the Year group bubble with other members of the school community. We have taken the advice of Public Health England, and following our internal policy, will send all of the Year 9 bubble home to self-isolate whilst we identify the child's close contacts.

This therefore is our notice to you that at 9:05am, we will be sending Year 9 home as previously agreed in this <u>letter</u>. A text has already been sent to all Year 9 parents.

We are sending all Year 9 home as we have followed the national guidance and have identified that your child may have been in close contact with the affected child due to them being in the Year 9 bubble.

In line with the national guidance your child must stay at home and self-isolate until **21st December** (14 days after possible contact, which is Monday 7th December). Students identified as close contacts would not return to school until the new year, Tuesday 5th January but would be out of self-isolation from Tuesday 22nd December.

Please do note that once we have investigated further and established close contacts with the student who has tested positive, we hope to be able to return some of the Year 9 bubble back to school sooner. We will clarify close contact lists tomorrow. Your child should access their work on google classroom today.

Other members of your household can continue normal activities provided your child does not develop symptoms within the 14-day self-isolation period.














### What to do if your child develops symptoms of COVID 19

If your child develops symptoms of COVID-19, they should remain at home for at least 10 days from the date when their symptoms appeared. Anyone with symptoms will be eligible for testing and this can be arranged via <a href="https://www.nhs.uk/ask-for-a-coronavirus-test">https://www.nhs.uk/ask-for-a-coronavirus-test</a> or by calling 119.

People who do not have symptoms should not request a test unless this has been specifically requested by Public Health England or the local authority.

All other household members who remain well must stay at home and not leave the house for 14 days. This includes anyone in your 'Support Bubble'.

The 14-day period starts from the day when the first person in the house became ill.

Household members should not go to work, school or public areas and exercise should be taken within the home. If you require help with buying groceries, other shopping or picking up medication, or walking a dog, you should ask friends or family. Alternatively, you can order your shopping online and medication by phone or online.

Household members staying at home for 14 days will greatly reduce the overall amount of infection the household could pass on to others in the community

If you are able can, move any vulnerable individuals (such as the elderly and those with underlying health conditions) out of your home, to stay with friends or family for the duration of the home isolation period

#### **Symptoms of COVID 19**

The most common symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19) are recent onset of:

- new continuous cough and/or
- high temperature and/or
- a loss of, or change in, normal sense of taste or smell (anosmia)

### For most people, coronavirus (COVID-19) will be a mild illness.

## How to stop COVID-19 spreading

There are things you can do to help reduce the risk of you and anyone you live with getting ill with COVID-19

### Do

- wash your hands with soap and water often do this for at least 20 seconds
- use hand sanitiser gel if soap and water are not available
- wash your hands as soon as you get home
- cover your mouth and nose with a tissue or your sleeve (not your hands) when you cough or sneeze
- put used tissues in the bin immediately and wash your hands afterwards
