1. The main lockdown learning issues

Problem	We addressed that by:	Pros and Cons of Solution
1. Lack of teacher interaction	Teaching half of all lessons LIVE	Pro – better for mental health. Independent lesson can be done at students' own pace. Con – students feel rushed by LIVE lesson pace
2. Larger classes for some subjects	 Putting in small classes for English and Maths. Smaller classes for Science and History. 	Pro – students absorb material better in Core smaller classes Con – not all lessons can be taught in original groupings
3. Teachers can't tell how much all students have understood.	 Providing Google Docs, Padlet, Chat function. LSAs to work with smaller groups within larger classes Small group work to continue in Numeracy, Literacy, Speech and Language, Mentoring. 	Pro – Students may feel less pressure to raise a hand in front of others. Con – students need to use new apps and technology and get used to using them in a lesson

SEND considerations from a teacher's perspective

To support home learning - Before the lesson:

- Links to appropriate resources are provided.
- A video is created which explains the task, key concepts and expectations. This allows the students to learn at a pace appropriate to themself.

To support home learning - During the lesson:

An LSA is monitoring a live document your child works on.
 This allows the LSA to check understanding, encourage work and help challenge the student.

To support home learning - After the lesson:

- A 'questions' box is provided to students to have a teacher respond to.
- A learning check is complete to check understanding.

Lesson resources are differentiated.

This can include:

- A variety of tasks and mediums to engage with the subject knowledge.
- Pictures which illustrate a concept or keyword.
- Easy to find and direct instructions
- Points of reflection and consolidation in the lesson.



Features such as Live Listen, RTT calls, and visual alerts help people who are deaf or hard of hearing use their iPhone, iPad, and iPod touch.


