Dear Parents and Carers,

I trust that everyone is keeping well.

Students' last day in school is Wednesday 20th October finishing at 3pm. All students return to school at the normal time Tuesday 2nd November. Term Dates 2021/22 Please also note that the school is closed for an additional day, Friday 27th May 2022, which is attached to the summer half term break. This is in recognition of the additional National Bank Holiday for the Queen's Golden Jubilee. However, at this time of year, both the Year 11 and 13 students will be on study leave and there will be GCSE/ A levels External examinations scheduled. These national examinations will be going ahead and are set nationally; Year 11 &13 students should avoid taking any holidays at this time.

The last two weeks have been very busy in school, with lots of educational visits, extra-curricular activities and our digital learning days taking place. We were fortunate enough to be visited by a couple of excellent external companies that delivered sessions to many of our students on social, cultural and moral themes; one such example being the 'Consequences' showcase delivered by the Epping Forest District Council. It's also been wonderful to see so many of our extra-curricular clubs back up and running; with a couple of new clubs arriving on the scene this academic year.

We are also looking forward to the Duke of Edinburgh's Silver Award Practice Expedition next week which will involve a group of Year 10 students. It represents a great opportunity for our students to be out on a three day and two night trip which will involve camping out in the Chilterns. The expeditions are just one aspect of the Award which also include Volunteering, developing a Skill, and Physical improving in an area of sport or fitness. The various activities should be completed during the course of the year and students will be assessed as they progress in order for them to receive the Award. The 'Bronze Award' for Year 9 students and the 'Gold Award' for Year 12 students will be launched shortly and we are already anticipating keen interest by the students in these year groups.

We have also had lots of 'digital learning' taking place in our classrooms over the last two weeks. Many of our teachers have been using innovative, digital activities in their lessons to be able to provide feedback to our students and use creative assessment tools. In England, a Free School Meal (FSM) is a statutory benefit available to school aged children from families who receive other qualifying benefits and who have been through the relevant registration process.

Recently, the process of applying for Free School Meals at Roding Valley High School has changed to an online application in order to improve speed and reduce the burden of paperwork for parents. For more information on the qualifying benefits and for more information, please visit our Free School Meals page on our school website.

It is important that parents register their children for free school meals if they are entitled as the school receives additional funding known as the Pupil Premium to support the children's learning. The use of the pupil premium is personalised to meet the needs of the children who are entitled to support, such as 1-1 tuition, additional LSA support and intervention groups, access to school visits, Learning Mentor, speech and language assistants, Family Support and counselling.

GCSE and A level drama students from Years 10 to 13 really enjoyed the performance, whether it was the biting critique of power and wickedness, or just the fart jokes, they were engaged throughout and saw an excellent example of how small scale theatre can think

# Food & Nutrition Recipes of the Week

# Spanish Omelette

## Ingredients:

- 500g potatoes
- **Knob of butter**
- 2 small onions
- 1 red pepper
- 3 4 mushrooms
- 8 eggs
- Handful of chives

## **Equipment Needed:**

- Measuring jug
- Whisk
- **Chopping board**
- Knife
- Frying pan
- Saucepan







#### Method

- 1. Slice the onions and chop the pepper, removing the seeds.
- 2. Cut the potatoes into roughly ½ cm slices
- Heat a knob of butter in a frying pan until melted, then add the red pepper and onions
- 4. In the meantime, put the potatoes in a saucepan, bring to the boil and simmer for 8-10 minutes to soften.
- Break the eggs into a jug and beat with a whisk or fork and season well with salt and pepper.
- 6. Add a little more butter to the frying pan and add the potatoes. Pour over the egg mixture and cook for 15 minutes until almost set and golden-brown underneath.
- 7. Put the frying pan under the grill (make sure the handle is outside the oven) and cook for a further 2 minutes until cooked.

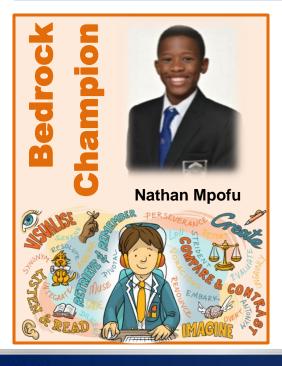

Please have a very restful half term and come back refreshed ready for another excellent half term.

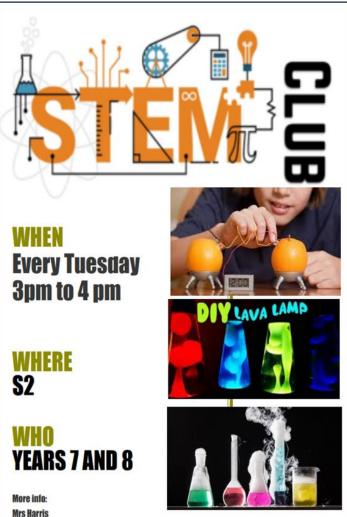

# ir Child Safe Online tur Eight Steps to Keep



- **Explore together:** Ask your child to show you their favourite websites and apps and what they do on them. Listen, show interest and encourage them to teach you the basics of the site or app.
- Chat about online safety little and often: Young people are likely to want to explore new apps and websites this month, whether that is for learning or for fun. Take this opportunity to 2 talk to them about how to stay safe on these new services, and in general. Ask if anything ever worries them while they are online. Make sure they know that if they ever feel worried, they can get help by talking to you or another adult they trust.
- Help your child identify trusted adults who can help them if they are worried: This includes you and other adults at home, as well as adults from wider family, school or 3 other support services who they are able to contact at this time. Encourage them to draw a picture or write a list of their trusted adults.
- Be non-judgemental: Explain that you would never blame them for anything that might happen online, and you will always give them calm, loving support.
- Talk about how their online actions can affect others: If your child is engaging with others online, remind them to consider how someone else might feel before they post or 5 share something. If they are considering sharing a photo/video of somebody else, they should always ask permission first.
- Parental controls: Make use of the parental controls available on your home broadband 6 and any internet enabled device in your home. You can find out more about how to use parental controls by visiting your broadband provider's website.
- Direct your child to age appropriate information about relationships and sex: It's natural for young people to start exploring their sexual feelings online and adolescents are more inclined to take risks. It's important to understand this and to talk to your child in a positive way. Thinkuknow, Brook, The Mix and Childline all provide age appropriate information about relationships and sex that you can signpost your child to.
- Make sure they know about CEOP: Young people can report 8 a concern about grooming or sexual abuse to CEOP at www.ceop.police.uk/safety-centre/ and get support from a specialist Child Protection Advisor.

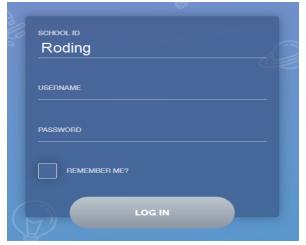












#### **How Can I Access Edulink?**

## **Navigating Edulink**

You are able to navigate each of the following areas in EduLink:

- Achievement: You van view all positive achievements that have been awarded to your child
- **Behaviour:** You will be able to see all behaviour points given to you child and any sanctions given to your child including detentions.
- Medical Information: In this section you can see all of the medical information that we have on file for your child
- Account Information: In this section you can view the current address we have for your child on file, your child's Year group and the name of their Form tutor
- **Timetable:** In this section you can view your child's daily timetable
- Absence Reporting: This feature will allow you to send a direct message to our Attendance Officer, to notify us of any absence for your child
- Linked Resources: This section contains links to all the schools learning resources available to your child both at school and at home
- **Update Information:** This section shows all of the contact information we hold for yourself and your child. You can review and update this information with any changes that may occur
- **Exams:** You can see all of your child upcoming exams; your child can also access this information so they can manage their own exam schedule
- **Documents:** In this section you can view your child's reports

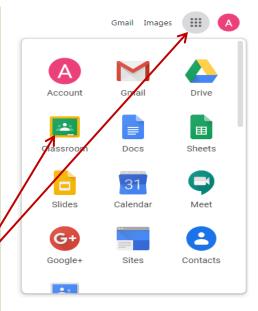
# Google Classroom

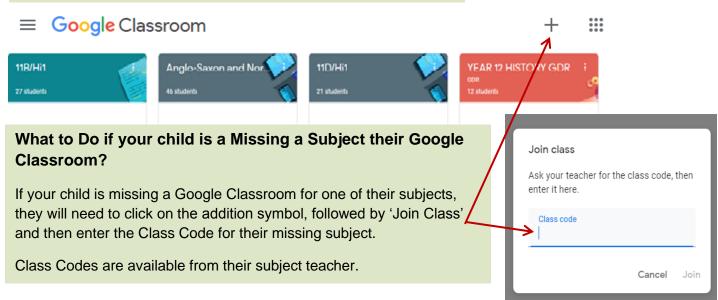
### How to Log on to Google Classroom?

Students can log into their Gmail using their school email address and their password. Their school email will be the year they started at RVHS started plus their first initial and surname @rodingvalley.net (example- 19plarkin@rodingvalley.net).

Once your child has have logged in, they will need to click on the google apps button and then select 'Google Classroom'

Your child will then be able to see all of the classes they belong to. They will then need to click on the class they want to use resources for and take a look at everything that their class teacher has posted for them to work on. They will be able to download items and make comments on them. Teachers will be regularly posting new work on their Google Classrooms.

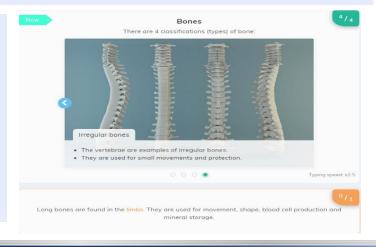
